

The name change was a consequence of a branding change by HSBC, who manage the underlying fund in which this fund invests. The fund objective, risk exposure and benchmark remain unchanged.


Fund objective

This fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing in the shares of the largest 100 companies engaged in Sharia-compliant activities around the world. The fund aims to track the performance of the Dow Jones Islamic Titans 100 Index by investing in the companies that make up that index, in the same proportions.

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



Differences in performance reporting between fund and benchmark may arise due to the impact of timing, charges, cashflows, and the pricing basis of the underlying fund. Fund returns are calculated on a total return basis with dividends reinvested.

The value of your plan depends directly on a number of things, including the level of your pensions savings, charges, investment returns and the annuity rates available to buy your pension income when you decide to take your benefits.
